# DAILY DEVOTIONS FROM LUTHERAN HOUR MINISTRIES

## "More than Expected"

As for you, you meant evil against me, but God meant it for good, to bring it about that many people should be kept alive, as they are today. Genesis 50:20

The parents of Minnesota's 10-year-old Mackenzie Moretter wanted to give her a birthday party.

To make that wish a reality they invited 10 girls to the festivities.

For whatever reasons, all ten girls were unable to be at the celebration. Naturally, Moretter, who has some speech and learning difficulties, felt she had been ostracized by people she had hoped were her pals. It was a dark time for her and the entire Moretter family.

But what could be done? After all, you can't force people to come to a birthday party.

Let me tell you what happened. First, Moretter's parents decided to try again. Her mom went on Facebook and explained the situation. She asked for a number of girls -- girls who were *strangers* -- to help her out and come to her daughter's party.

Mom got more than she bargained for.

People read that Facebook page and they were touched by Moretter's story. In a few hours, hundreds of people said, "We're coming!" Included in that list was the mayor of the town where the Moretter family lives. He came and he also declared the party day: "Mackenzie Moretter Day."

About 400 people showed up, including Minnesota Vikings widereceiver Charles Johnson and his family. Some folks showed their support by sending money and local businesses donated food to feed the festive throng.

And Mackenzie ... how about Mackenzie? She said, "I have a hard time making friends in school, but thanks to all of you ... my voice was heard. I love you all." Her mom says they are going to use the extra money they had received to support organizations that put on birthday parties for sick children.

The whole story reminds me of the biblical narrative of Joseph. Having been sold into slavery by his brothers, years later, after the Lord had lifted him to a position of power, he told his brothers, "you meant evil against me, but God meant it for good ...."

All of this means there is a lesson to be learned here.

There is no doubt there is evil in this world. But that doesn't mean God's people must accept it. There are times we can look evil in the face, dig in our heels, and ask the Holy Spirit to help us change things. That's what Moretter's mother did; it's what the mayor of Shakopee, Minnesota, did; it's what those businesses and guests at the party did. And it's what we can do too. It's what we do as we reach out to others in love, even as Jesus did the same for us.

**THE PRAYER:** Dear Lord, we live in a world which is very evil. Quite often that evil likes to push us around. Help us realize that we, in the Savior's Name, can push back in a most loving way. When we do, we pray the Holy Spirit will turn evil into good. In Jesus' Name I pray it. Amen.

## NATIONAL DAY OF PRAYER MAY 2, 2024



'LIFT UP THE WORD – LIGHT UP THE WORLD' based on 2 Samuel 22:29-31

<sup>29</sup> For you are my lamp, O LORD, and my God lightens my darkness.
<sup>30</sup> For by you I can run against a troop, and by my God I can leap over a wall.
<sup>31</sup> This God—his way is perfect; the word of the LORD proves true; he is a shield for all those who take refuge in him.

On May 2, 2024, join thousands of Americans across our nation as we pray for America on the National Day of Prayer.

"This year's theme, "Lift Up the Word, Light Up the World," came from a significant time of fervent prayer and a bit of what I will call "holy frustration." I am sure you have experienced "holy frustration" when God breaks your heart for what breaks His, or you know God's will from His Word is not being regarded or accomplished. Our first response in these moments is to ask the Holy Spirit to "Search me, God, and know my heart; test me and know my anxious thoughts. See if there is any offensive way in me and lead me in the way everlasting." (Psalm 139:23-24) In every situation that we find frustration leading to anxiousness we need to examine ourselves and honestly determine if we are participating in the problem, then repent and diligently seek God in prayer and Scripture to determine His holy solution.


In this case, I had become frustrated, even weary of hearing people talk so much about the "darkness" that they perceive is taking over America and the world. It seemed all conversations led to pointing out the darkness in all areas of our communities and Country. I could almost envision Satan smiling, taking a bow, and thanking us for praising all his work. **Satan is not an equal foe to God Almighty**, he is a fallen created being who days are short, and head is being crushed by our Lord Jesus Christ. (Gen. 3:15) The darkness was not just an issue of Satan's work; sadly we, the Church, are to blame as well because **darkness is an absence of light**. Jesus pronounced that we, as His followers, are the light of the world, not to be hidden but to shine, to dispel the darkness. (John 8:12, Matt. 5:14)

God is Light and in Him is no darkness. (1 John 1:5-6) He has rescued us from the dominion of darkness and brought us into His Kingdom of Light. (Col.1:13) **You and I do not stumble around in the darkness; we light it up! Our presence, our attitudes, words,**  and actions should brighten the day and way of everyone we encounter as we are filled with the Holy Spirit, Jesus fills our hearts, God's Word is a lamp to our feet and a light to our path. (Psalm 119:105)

God did not put a dimmer switch on His people. If our communities and country are getting darker it is because we are covering up our light; keeping quiet when we should speak up, only looking to our own interests when we should be tending to the issues of our towns. We are guilty of stepping back from the fight to maintain righteousness in our schools, government, entertainment, business decisions, defending the weak and oppressed, and even deciding to "keep the peace" in our family and church instead of obeying the Prince of Peace. Things seem "darker" in this world because we let it by refusing to "LIGHT" it. For every time we said, "I don't want to be 'that' person" or we were more concerned about offending someone instead of our Savior, we let the darkness take more ground."

Early Christians regarded the Feast of the Ascension as one of the major feasts of the Christian calendar. It was the final of the major festivals celebrating Christ's life. Ancient Christians celebrated the feast by taking part in celebrations and services in the open air, on a hill or in the countryside. Processions to those places imitated Jesus' journey with the disciples to the Mount of Olives. They celebrated the Feast of the Ascension with great joy even as the disciples were full of joy after Jesus' ascension (Luke 24:52). Joy does not seem so obvious after Jesus departed from them, but their hearts were filled with the messages of the ascension.

The ascension message proclaims that Jesus, who left heaven and came to earth, has returned to heaven having completed His mission. The visible presence of the Lord on earth may have ceased, but He does not cease to be with His earthly people in His flesh and blood sharing with them His divine life. His rule over all things has commenced as He sits at God's right hand on high. Christ, who forevermore lives in human flesh and blood, now reigns at God's right hand. He went there to prepare a place for us and will return in glory having put all our enemies, last of all death. under His feet.

In the first act of His rule, He sent His Spirit on Pentecost so that the apostles and pastors could be sent to preach His name to all nations, bringing to all people the forgiveness of sins and the gift of eternal life that He won on the cross. The ascension also includes the promise that we will ascend over every sin, death and even hell itself, passing over one day to our glorious rest in heaven. The celebration of this feast works this teaching and joy in us.

In former times, the joy of the feast spanned from Ascension to Pentecost, a 10-day mini season known as Ascensiontide. The color white remains on the altar. Special joyous ascension hymns are sung. The paschal candle may be moved from the altar to its regular place by the baptismal font. Some congregations extinguish the light of this Easter candle after the reading of the Gospel, marking the beginning of the time when we apprehend Christ not by sight but by faith.

AMAZING POWER Pentecost Sunday, May 19, 2024 When Jesus was arrested, his apostles had fled in fear. Peter found himself in a situation where fear compelled him to deny that he even knew Christ.

All of Christ's followers were in

**PENTECOST:** hiding – broken-hearted, totally confused, feeling absolutely hopeless. Then, **on the Jewish Day of Pentecost, the Holy Spirit came mightily upon them**. **Suddenly, they were empowered.** Immediately they were galvanized. Right then and there, they were filled with enormous courage. Boldly, forthrightly, not far from the site of the crucifixion, they began to proclaim that Jesus was risen from the dead & that he was certainly the long-awaited Messiah. The fire of the Holy Spirit burned so vividly that people from all over came to see and hear what the apostles were claiming. Peter told them the story of Christ as best he could. Then Peter offered his hearers the opportunity to become Christ's followers. Amazingly, 3,000 people responded to the offer (Acts 2:41)! **We now call that event The Birthday of the Christian Church!** 

## HOLY TRINITY SUNDAY May 26, 2024



## Holy Trinity Sunday, the Sunday following Pentecost, is the day on which the Athanasian Creed is spoken and the Church confesses it's belief in the Trinity.

"On Trinity Sunday, the Christian Church ponders with joy and thanksgiving what the Father, Son and Holy Spirit have done to accomplish the salvation of sinful humanity. It is brought to remembrance how Christians should respond to the love God has shown for us, praising Him and giving Him glory. We remember the Father as our Creator, the Son as our Savior and the Holy Spirit as our Comforter. Scripture that is read at Pentecost often include Psalm 8 which says, "O Lord, our Lord, how majestic is your name in all the earth! You have set your glory above the heavens. Out of the mouth of babies and infants, you have established strength." 2 Corinthians 13:11-13 appeals to believers to aim for perfection and live in peace, ending with the prayer that the grace of Christ Jesus, the love of God and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with all, including again the commission Jesus left for believers in Mathew 28:16-20.

Trinity Sunday is to explain, to the best of our ability, the clues written in Scripture to guide us to a fuller understanding of our triune God. The Father is God from the beginning (John 1:1). Jesus revealed Himself as equal to the Father in John 10:30. "I and the Father are one." Together, they sent the Holy Spirit. The Bible tells us, "For there are three that bear record in Heaven, the Father, the Word and the Holy Spirit, and these three are one" (1 John 5:7-11). To understand the Trinity is to understand God more fully."



## **Good Shepherd Lutheran Church**

Greetings from St. Louis!

At the time of writing this letter there is 1.5 Months or 6 Weeks or 42 days to Call Day, but who is counting. After almost 4 years of schooling, we are almost there! Interviews for calls began late January and ended the first week of March, now all that is left is to wait and pray that God's will be done, trusting He knows what is best for us and for the churches we will be assigned to.

If you are not familiar with the process, or it's been a while. First Calls are handled by the placement director at the seminary Dr. Nielsen (Who is just a wealth of knowledge and connections having placed some of the Fathers for guys in my class in their first calls.) and the LCMS council of presidents. Together they collect the names of all the eligible students and calling congregations around the country. Then based on the needs of the churches, the skills and abilities of the students, and their preferences for types of ministries (i.e. urban, rural, or suburban, small, or large church, traditional or contemporary worship, and sole or team ministry), they do their best to match everyone up with the help of the Holy Spirt for wisdom and guidance. Part of this process may include interviews especially for team ministry situations so that the current Sr. Pastor can connect with the potential new associate and make sure they will be a good fit for their church, and ministry team.

I personally was a part of two interviews, one with a large church and school in the south and the other with a small church out west which was a church merger just a few years ago. Just because I had an interview with these churches does not mean I will get a call to one of them. The church still has the ability to say no, and I have the ability after the interview to say I really don't think that church would be a good fit and here is why. Plus, the Council of presidents gets the final say and could chose to place you somewhere completely different that they think would be a better fit. With all of that both of the churches I interviewed with have their own positives and negatives. Which will be true for all churches, so I can't wait for Tuesday April 23<sup>rd</sup> which is Call Day. The service will be held at 7pm CT and streamed online. If you would like to watch you can do so at CSL.edu. Or wait for my next letter which will include all the details.

If you are wondering in all of this how the Navy chaplaincy is going, it is all coming along. The process is much longer than I thought but we are getting there. Since I don't have previous military experience, I will work for the Navy part time in the Reserves and for a church part time for two years after which time I can either decide to continue working part time for both or switch to Active-duty fulltime chaplaincy. One of the churches I have interviewed with is about 15min from a Navy base and the other is about 2hrs. that will be part of the pluses and minuses of these churches.

In the midst of all this excitement classes continue and so does the prep work for me as class president for all the end of year events here on campus for all the concluding students. Right now, I am working on planning the end of year Banquet for students and their spouses, a service project followed by a pig roast and bonfire just for the students as a time to celebrate together one last time. As well as planning the Class Gift we will leave behind and a gift our class will send to the concluding class at Concordia Theological Seminary Ft. Wayne. Fortunately, my classmates are helping out with all of this planning including one of the guys who found a site where we can order personalized copies of Luther's Sacristy Prayer which will be our gift to the Class at Ft. Wayne. The prayer is such a great reminder of the work God is doing in and through our lives in the office of the ministry.

I really can't wait to share with you where God will be leading me next, and I ask of your prayers in these concluding weeks, as senioritis has certainty stared to set in, but there is still much more to learn and time to be had together as a class before we go from here.



## DAY 1 | DEPARTURE




